

Announcement of Doctoral Graduate Assistantship

Clemson University Department of Parks, Recreation, & Tourism Management

Dr. Em V. Adams, from the Clemson University Recreational Therapy program is currently seeking qualified applicants for a Ph.D. Graduate Assistantship starting in Fall 2023. This assistantship provides a competitive stipend to on-campus students and includes a full tuition wavier (excluding fees). Assistantships are for the 9-month academic year and cover 20 hours of work per week. Assistantships are renewable for 4 academic years for Ph.D. students, contingent upon satisfactory performance. Additional pay may be available during the academic year and summer months to teach and/or work on grant-funded projects.

The Graduate Assistant would assist with the design, data collection, and publication of grant-funded projects related to the prevention of and building resilience after violence, injury, and trauma. Well-qualified graduate applicants should have interest in at least one of the following topics: in culturally affirming healthcare practices, trauma-informed care, intimate partner violence, interprofessional practice/education, healthcare well-being and burnout prevention.
