Registrar's Office Acceptance Policy for Changes to Courses and Curricula

Clemson University's student information system (iROAR), Undergraduate catalog; and degree progress system (Degree Works) only reflect courses and curricula approved by the University Undergraduate Curriculum Committee (UCC). Changes, additions and deletions are submitted to and reviewed by the UCC from January through May and September through December.

The Undergraduate catalog is published in late spring for the upcoming curriculum/academic year. Currently, the December UCC meeting is the approval deadline for items to be published in the next year's Undergraduate catalog. For example, items approved at the December 2016 UCC meeting will appear in the 2017-18 Undergraduate catalog. If the change, addition or deletion is approved after the December UCC meeting, it will be reflected in the following year's Undergraduate catalog. For example, items approved at January 2017 UCC meeting will be reflected in the 2018-19 Undergraduate catalog.

Course additions will be reflected in iROAR for whichever current or future term is indicated on the course addition form. Course deletions will be reflected in iROAR for whichever current or future term is indicated on the course deletion form, unless students are registered in a section of the course for the term indicated, in which case the course will be ended in the first future term with no registrations. Course changes (changes to credits, prerequisites, etc.) will be reflected in iROAR for whichever current future term is indicated on the form, unless students are registered in a section of the course for the term indicated, in which case the changes will be reflected in the first future term with no registrations with the following exception: It is only appropriate that certain changes, such as changes to prerequisites, credits, course subject codes and course numbers, etc., be effective for a fall term. Therefore, such course changes will be reflected in iROAR for the first future fall term with no registrations.

Degree Works reflects the approved courses and curricula in the current Undergraduate catalog for the curriculum year. If it is determined that a course may be used universally to substitute for a curriculum requirement, then the department must submit a blanket substitution as notification to UCC. Changes, additions and deletions to course lists must also be submitted as a notification to UCC. All curriculum modifications must be submitted through the UCC, and must adhere to the same deadlines as stated in paragraph two. Curriculum modifications must indicate which catalog years in history the change should be applied. Blanket substitutions and changes to course lists are valid for only one year. Therefore, to additionally make the change effective for the upcoming Undergraduate catalog, an official UCC change of curriculum form including an updated curriculum map, is required and must be submitted along with the notification.

Appling welcomed the committee.

Approval of minutes

The committee approved the February meeting minutes.

New Business

- A. Memo – Department of Marketing – Blanket Subs – Wilson stated that everything looked good, but she needs the years of coverage. The committee discussed if this was a change to the “see advisor list” or a true blanket sub. Hamby reminded the committee that a new curriculum map must be presented when blanket subs are updated. Appling stated that a new policy is coming in April that will solidify this. The committee tabled the memo for additional information.

Old Business

- A. General Education Task Force Update –Trogden presented there has been great discussions of content areas that effect learning outcomes, and these ended yesterday. She reported that, to date, 230 faculty and staff have participated in these discussions and blogs. She stated the task force will reassemble to evaluate the qualitative data that has come out of these meetings, but nothing will come to this committee until the fall. Trogden reported that Faculty Senate has approve the ad hoc, General Education subcommittee, so the colleges can vote on memberships this spring.
- B. Curriculog – Appling reported that Curriculog training has been delayed due to the single sign-on deferment, so we do not have time to train and pilot in the spring, so we will move it to summer or early fall. He reported that attending the DigarcU conference was eye opening for him about how we can use Curriculog in creative ways. He stated that he also learned that robust help throughout the forms is very important. He shared that as Lavonne Sloop, from the Graduate School, was updating the help fields for graduate forms, she realized there was missing data, which we had not discovered previously. Appling closed by stating that we will move slowly to ensure the forms, guidelines, and help areas are correct before we open Curriculog up to piloting and training.
