Murdoch convened the meeting at 1:30 PM

Approval of minutes

The committee approved the November meeting minutes.

Old Business

- A. General Education The committee members discussed the review of the White Paper to Address the Introduction of General Education Interest Area. Several committee members agreed there were pluses and minuses on both sides. Silvestri stated that his college was ambivalent, but felt the proposal mirrored the student minor curriculum.
- B. Review of CBBS General Education Proposal Coggeshall proposed tracking or silo-ing general education. Committee members discussed, but continued to mention funding issues, and determined that funding problems must be addressed before any real proposal can be considered. Murdoch encouraged the committee to discuss among their college and tabled further discussion for the December meeting.
- C. General Education Course Review Coggeshall distributed and discussed his findings of Social Science and Cross Cultural Awareness syllabus review (copy attached) and additional information can be found through the online service of the syllabus repository. Kosinski proposed this same concept to his college about evaluating the syllabus to ensure the competency and artifacts met the general education requirement. Murdoch reported the Chairs of the General Education subcommittees will be taking a look at each course, and we will continue to discuss at future meetings.
- **D.** Proposed Revision to the Natural Science Competency The committee discussed, and Murdoch called for a vote, all approved, none opposed.
- **E. Proposed Revision to the Cross-Cultural Awareness Competency** Coggeshall requested proposal be tabled for now because they are not ready to make a change, and the committee agreed.

New Business

A. Language Requirement for International Students – Murdoch introduced Skip Sauer. Sauer explained that he was here to address issues for international students who face problems with the language requirement. He reported that the requirement becomes an issue if the international student's foreign language is not offered here at Clemson. He suggested that we need a consistent system to deal with these particular students. Sauer stated that it would be beneficial for students to take a course with added value to their education rather than a course

just to meet the requirement. Committee members discussed. Members suggested use of the TOFEL scores to determine if English is truly the second language. Someone suggested a specific English course for these students, but several were opposed due to the undue burden this would place on the English department. Mack suggested looking into how other universities handle this. Coggeshall suggested finding out what the Language department thought about this. Murdoch tabled for further discussion.

B. Committee reports

- a. Arts & Humanities Bruce Whisler The subcommittee recommends approval of STS 215 for A&H non-literature credit. The committee approved.
- b. Mathematical & Natural Sciences Bob Green

- d. Cross Cultural Awareness Mike Coggeshall The subcommittee is not recommending approval of REL 312/313 for CCA credit. The committee denied approval.
- e. Science & Technology in Society Pam Mack

Other Business

Appling stated that he would like to float something by members about students taking a CU4000 course to complete their ePortfolio, with the requirement that students must complete the course before they can graduate. Appling said that it would be useless if it is not a requirement. He reported this course would provide an opportunity for true self-reflection and provide an opportunity for deeper study of competencies and artifacts. Committee members liked the idea, so Appling agreed to put something together.

College of Business and Behavioral Science Report on Tracking or "Silo-ing" of General Education October 11, 2013

The College Curriculum Committee of the College of Business and Behavioral Science met on Friday, October 11 (regular meeting date/time) and discussed the "White Paper" on "tracking" or "silo-ing" General Education at Clemson. Additional comments flowed through email exchanges.

We recognize (1) that Clemson has promised SACS that our QEP will address General Education, (2) that the students have concerns about the logical organization and academic rigor of courses within General Education at Clemson, and (3) that students frequently select General Education courses to fit their schedules for convenience rather than for a "logical" sequence. Nevertheless:

- 1. The College representatives are not in favor of tracking or "silo-ing" General Education;
- 2. In order to address student concerns about General Education more effectively, we would like to know the specific student-perceived problem(s) with General Education, and how those problems were measured, before undertaking any changes. We need to have a systematic and data-driven approach to discovering problems before modifying General Education.
- 3. We would also like to know how our academic peers approach the organizational logic and pedagogical presentation of General Education before undertaking any changes.

Our concerns about "tracking" General Education are both pedagogical and administrative:

Pedagogical Concerns:

- 1. We believe "tracking" goes against the idea of a "general education;"
- 2. We strongly believe students should have multiple experiences from a variety of courses;

Advising Concerns:

- 1. Many students change majors while at Clemson, and many others have difficulty choosing a minor. For example, in our college we find most student are not sure what concentration they are interested in completing when they change their major from pre-business to management, marketing and finance after being at Clemson for a year. Thus, for most students, having to choose a "silo" or "concentration" for General Education will be equally challenging, but this decision is especially critical since most students take a majority of their General Education requirements during their first and second semester at Clemson.
- 2. Would transfer students complete a "track" as well? If so, might that delay their progress? Would the delay from the necessity of completing a "track" cause students to choose another university instead?

Solution

We propose the addition of a new competency for General Education – we suggest that students write an essay for their e-portfolios, explaining the decisions they made to take the General Education courses they took. This essay will urge the students (a) to take more seriously their initial Gen Ed choices; (b) to encourage them to find their own logical links between courses (links that might lie outside our narrow "silos"); and (c) to find in every Gen Ed course at least some learning outcome or skill that they might apply to their career and/or to life-long learning. This new competency would be completed in their last semester, as a reflection piece combining both their General Education and major/minor coursework.

We see this new competency as a way of empowering students to make their own decisions, find their own creative links, develop their own critical thinking, and reflect on their own learning outcomes as they near graduation. Our goal is to foster life-long learning and creative thinking in all Clemson graduates.

In addition, we also suggest:

- 1. All Faculty teaching General Education courses should be informed about Gen Ed goals, competencies, and artifacts;
- 2. All Faculty teaching General Education courses should be annually reviewed on "teaching effectiveness" and "academic rigor," not on "student satisfaction." In other words, Faculty should be encouraged to follow the new Guidelines for Measuring Teaching Effectiveness as outlined in the Faculty Manual;
- 3. All departments should be strongly encouraged to integrate General Education requirements into the first or second curriculum years (or at least by the end of the third year);
- 4. The Undergraduate Announcements should include introductory paragraphs for all areas of General Education, explaining the pedagogical purposes of the different areas.
- 5. All academic advisors should be strongly encouraged to help students select General Education courses that make some logical sense to the student, in relation to their individual programs of study.

Attached is the Excel spreadsheet containing information from my syllabus search. I have a few notes of explanation to include:

- 1- I changed the "Semester" column to "Most Recent Syllabus" because there were a couple classes which had a more recent syllabus listed in the repository, but the links were broken. I included this explanation in the "Notes" column for the affected classes.
- 2- I added the column "E-Portfolio Instructions" to indicate whether specific mention was made of how the course activities fit into the e-portfolio assignment.
- 3- I altered the color of the rows in order to visually separate the courses. The intent was to make it easier to distinguish subtle differences (HIST 1010 vs 1020, etc.) and allow for easier comparison of individual sections within a specific course.
- 4- I tried to standardize the language of the notes and keep them as brief as possible.
- 5- There are three classes for which I could find no information, past or present (CAAH 2010, HIST 1930, & HUM 3090). I included them on the list and indicated their absence in the "Notes" column.

SUBJECT: Proposed revision to the Natural Science competency

New wording is in blue.

Over the summer, I evaluated ePortfolio Natural Science artifacts along with several other faculty. My group became convinced that some changes need to be made to the wording of the competency. The existing competency is:

(Existing) Demonstrate scientific literacy by explaining the process of scientific reasoning and applying scientific principles inside and outside of the laboratory or field setting.

We thought that this is misleading, vague, and too narrow. We don't want students to explain the scientific method, we want them to demonstrate it by applying it to a real problem. "Apply scientific principles" was vague. "Inside and outside of the laboratory or field setting" is so broad that it is meaningless. Trivial assignments like worksheets are sometimes submitted, and we want to avoid that. Finally, the only acceptable artifacts now describe experiments that gather data and test hypotheses. Those are certainly preferable, but we thought that artifacts that critically analyze scientific literature should also be allowed. This would help transfer students in non-science majors who no longer have access to work they did in their introductory courses and must do a substitute assignment close to graduation. Therefore, we propose the following rewording:

(Proposed) Demonstrate the process of scientific reasoning by performing an experiment and thoroughly discussing the results with reference to the scientific literature, or by studying a question through critical analysis of the evidence in the scientific literature.

If this competency revision is approved, we would rewrite the "student tips" as follows:

• The simplest and most common way to address this competency is to submit a report on a formal laboratory or field study. The best artifacts will report on a scientific experiment in which an hypothesis is tested, data

- are analyzed, and conclusions are drawn about the correspondence of the results to expected outcomes or values. These artifacts typically come from Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Geology, or Astronomy courses.
- Non-experimental (literature survey papers) may be submitted if they critically review natural science research, discuss and analyze issues raised by that research, and are best if they propose questions which arise from this analysis.
- The student's understanding of the science behind the experiment or literature should be evident in the artifact.
- Descriptions of routine measurement techniques, worksheets, short-answer assignments, book reports, PowerPoint presentations, lesson plans, and the like cannot demonstrate the Natural Science competency.
