

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

Happy New Year from Clemson Visual Arts! As we step into 2025, I am delighted to reflect on the accomplishments of our students, faculty, alumni, and friends. Together, we have set a strong foundation for growth, and I am looking forward to our semester ahead.

As evidenced in our fall Artists Teaching: Teaching Artists exhibition, our faculty are making vital contributions to timely research, including Artificial Intelligence and Virtual Reality in digital art and design learning, reflecting our department's commitment to innovation in contemporary art practice and equipping students to thrive in a rapidly changing world. Faculty innovation is also evident through regional and national creative activities such as leading artist-run galleries, producing films and media festivals, exhibiting art in public places, and advocating for underserved communities.

Student research will be highlighted in Conversations, curated by MFA candidates Maya McDonald and Jennifer Smith, under the guidance of Lee Gallery Director Denise Woodward-Detrich. We have an exceptional lineup of visiting artists and lecturers throughout the spring — and I hope you will join us to engage in the conversation.

Later in spring, we will celebrate the artistic and academic excellence of our students with the BFA and MFA thesis exhibitions. These capstone experiences provide a platform to present their work professionally and begin the next chapters of their artistic journeys. Finally, we will close our semester with the long-running ceramics studio sale, the second iteration of the Clemson Art Book Fair and Zine Fest, and a brand-new Media Art Festival showcasing student works in video, film and animation.

More than ever, our students and faculty are forming community partnerships to give back. Witnessing the dedicated efforts of the annual Habitat for Humanity build by our construction and architecture colleagues and students, I am pleased to share a newly created Habitat Housewarming Gift from Art. This purchase award by the art department will place original student artwork in the house at its permanent location, with the intention to help make the house a "home" for its new owners. We were gratified to see CAAC majors unite in an expanded approach to the annual tradition and demonstrate how our college disciplines can come together to serve our community. Furthermore, our students, faculty and alumni continue fundraising efforts for Hurricane Helene relief, demonstrating the power of art to support communities and drive positive change.


