Member-Member This Month

June Status

June turned very dry, very quickly. We did not record any measurable rain from June 6-28 as I write this month's column. Combined with mid-90's temperatures, wind and low humidity, the turf has begun to show stress, and it's easy to see the limitations of the irrigation system.

All in all, it was a productive month as the maintenance staff worked hard to get the course in top shape for the First Tee National Championship immediately followed by the Club Championship.

July

As I mentioned last month, aerification was postponed this year until the week of July 8-12 due to the First Tee event. We will be aerifying greens and fairways and are planning to verticut the fairways as well.

Typically, full recovery for the greens takes about 28 days. As they begin to recover, we will begin lowering the mowing height back down, begin brushing and grooming daily, applying growth regulator and verticutting every 7-14 days. All these processes will help to smooth the greens and increase ball roll.

Also, in July, we will be cutting the natural areas back. The "Turnip" patches on holes 2, 5 & 6 will have run their course. We will cut them back and then get them ready to reseed about September 1st. The fescue areas will be cut back and sprayed for weeds.

Because of the timing of aerification week this year, we will not be doing any additional projects at this time. Hopefully, we can return to our traditional aerification dates in 2025 and do some course improvement projects then.

18th Hole Update

The work on #18 pond sped up a bit in June, and we have completed most of the golf course side and placed sod between the wall and the newly paved cartpath. Work was suspended the week of June 24th for the First Tee event.

Before the back side of the pond is completed, we are going to take the opportunity to dig out the sediment at the bottom of the pond. This will allow us to deepen the pond back to its original specs and should improve water quality and appearance. Now is the time to do it before the wall is completed.

National Golf Day Follow Up

As I mentioned here last month, I attended National Golf Day in Washington DC, May 8-10, representing GCSAA with the American Golf Industry Coalition.

The three main priority topics that we addressed with members of Congress were;

- 1. Continued support for Turfgrass Research and Development in the Farm Bill to continue researching turfgrass genetics and how to use this genetic information to produce turfgrass varieties with heat, drought, salt disease and traffic tolerance.
- 2. Modernizing the US tax code to remove golf courses from the list of businesses and industries that are disqualified and unworthy of various forms of disaster relief and economic stimulus programs that are available to other businesses such as restaurants, hotels, and attractions. For example, if a hurricane hit Myrtle Beach and it was declared a federal disaster area, restaurants and hotels could apply for disaster relief funds and low interest loans while golf courses could not.
- 3. Support for the PHIT act, which would offer over 100 million Americans the option to use their HAS/FSA funds on activity expenses to lower the cost of healthy lifestyles.
