Anesthesiologist assistants (AAs) are medical professionals who help plan and deliver anesthesia care.

They work under the supervision of licensed anesthesiologists. AAs, who are also called anesthetists, help coordinate and implement care before, during and after surgery.

There are many reasons students choose a career as an anesthesiologist assistant. The field is one of the fastest growing occupations in the health care industry. It provides an excellent income and flexible hours with opportunity for overtime and weekend and night work.

Applying to anesthesiology assistant programs

In addition to showing solid academic performance, students pursuing a career as an anesthesiologist assistant should be able to work in a team environment, have excellent communication skills, be compassionate and be able to perform under pressure. AAs typically complete a master's degree program with didactic coursework and clinical
